The January field trip will be to the Chickahominy Wildlife Management Area located in Charles City County. The best way to get to the management area is to take I-64 to Rt. 199. Take Rt. 199 to Rt. 5, John Tyler Highway. From Rt. 5, turn right onto Wilcox Neck Road. The entrance to the management area is on the right, Eagles Nest Rd. Meet at 8:00am in first parking area on the right hand side. The management area is located 11 miles outside Williamsburg.

Thanks to a TogetherGreen grant from the National Audubon Society and Toyota, the Virginia Important Bird Area (IBA) Program has held two TogetherGreen volunteer events. The IBA program worked alongside the US Fish and Wildlife Service and the Richmond Audubon Society, IBA Adopter for the Lower James River IBA, to coordinate the first event on September 24th and October 1st. Volunteers conducted a fall bird survey at the James River National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) and worked on several infrastructure projects at the Presquile NWR, both a part of the Lower James River IBA. The second TogetherGreen event was held at the Western Shores Marshes IBA on November 5th and was put together by the Virginia IBA Program and the Williamsburg and Hampton Roads Bird Clubs, who have co-adopted the Western Shore Marshes IBA. The November 5th event took place at Bethel Beach and New Point Comfort to engage volunteers in a bird survey and picking up and disposing of/recycling trash. VSO Winter Field Trip

North Carolina Outer Banks

February 3-5, 2012

Make plans to join us at the Outer Banks of North Carolina February 3-5 for the VSO's Winter field trip. We always have great waterfowl, shorebirds and raptors, along with a wide assortment of land birds. This year we're excited to announce a special optional Friday trip to Lake Mattamuskeet, led by VSO member Lee Adams.

Lodging: The Comfort Inn at Kill Devil Hills will be the trip headquarters. The special VSO room rate is \$65 for oceanfront and \$60 for street side plus tax. Ocean front rooms are available on a first come, first served basis. Contact information for the hotel is: 1601 S. Virginia Dare Trail, Kill Devil Hills, NC 27948; Phone: 252-441-6333; fax 252-441-7779. Reservations must be made by January 13, 2012 to get the special VSO rate.

Meals are on your own. A complimentary breakfast buffet breakfast is included with your stay, beginning each morning at 6:30 AM. You can select from coffee, juice, fruit, cereal, Danish, hard-boiled eggs, and make-your-own waffles. Participants should bring lunch provisions for Friday (optional trip) and Saturday. For dinner there are many fine restaurants in the area.

Program: A program of events and announcements will be available at the front desk on Friday morning.

Friday: A day-trip to Lake Mattamuskeet will be led by Lee Adams, who has explored this area with NC birding groups and knows all the "hot spots!" Last year they spotted a Screech Owl, American Bittern and Common Gallinule. Species often found here include Snow Goose, Tundra Swan, and various ducks. Meet in the hotel lobby at 7:15 AM for 7:30 departure. Bring snacks, beverage and lunch. The group will stop at Alligator River on the return trip to listen for Short-eared Owls at dusk.

Friday Night: An orientation and slide program will be given at 8:00 PM in the conference room near the lobby.

Saturday: All day will be spent visiting impoundments at Pea Island National Wildlife Refuge and the beaches of Cape Hatteras National Seashore. The generally milder climate and the proximity of the Gulf Stream make for an interesting mix of wintering waterfowl, shorebirds, ocean birds and sometimes whales. Participants may be divided into smaller groups, but every group will visit all areas. Participants should bring lunch.

Saturday Evening: There will be a tally at 6:30 PM in the VSO conference room at the hotel.

Sunday Morning: We'll travel in caravan to Alligator River National Wildlife Refuge. We will depart from the hotel at 8:00 AM, those continuing straight home from the field trip will have time to check out of their rooms.

Lots of participants choose to head for national parks, nature centers, urban parks, nature trails, or nearby sanctuaries. The count also includes a photo contest and a prize drawing for participants who enter their bird checklists online.

Birding CBBT BY BOAT

21 January 2012 Boat Trip

Again this year, the Williamsburg Bird Club is sponsoring a birding boat trip to the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel Islands Saturday, January 21, 2012. Enjoy our beautiful Chesapeake Bay and its winter bird life with us!

Geoff Giles, has chartered a large comfortable boat for this eye-level look at the bay ducks, scoters, shore birds and seabirds plus other wonderful species such

as the harbor seals we saw last year around the tunnel islands. Photo opportunities should be very good from the boat. We will stay around the CBBT tunnel islands and pilings and will likely go as far as Fisherman's Island on the Eastern Shore.

We will depart from Lynnhaven Inlet in Virginia Beach on Saturday, January 21, at 9 am and return to the dock at about 1 pm. There is a very good seafood restaurant dockside for those inclined to have lunch on return. If the trip gets weathered out, we'll return your check, of course. Should that happen, we will try for a rain date one week later. Note that we will not cash your check until after the trip.

Cost is \$25 per person. Sign up early so we can be sure to have enough people for the trip to go -- we need 30. Reservations will be taken on a first come, first served basis until the trip is filled. Your check is your reservation.

The group concentrated the morning of the 62nd Street entrance and boat landing but stopped by the beach side before returning to the Peninsula. Ducks were still scarce but several Horned Grebes were a treat. Some other good finds included Brown-headed Nuthatch, Cedar Waxwing, Yellow-bellied Sapsucker, Bufflehead, and Swamp Sparrow.
